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Project Report For Provision of Sustainable Lighting for 225 Earthquake-Affected Families

Location: Myokying Village, Sitgaing Region

Date: 10th July 2025

Dear Ms Monika,

1. Background

On 28th March 2025, the Sitgaing Region was affected by a moderate earthquake that caused significant disruption to the lives of many families, particularly in Myokying Village. The disaster damaged homes and disrupted access to electricity, leaving the village in darkness and insecurity. In response to this urgent need, the Sisters of St. Francis Xavier initiated a project to provide **sustainable lighting solutions** to improve safety, support daily living, and restore a sense of normalcy to affected households.

2. Project Objective

The main objective of this project was to:

- Provide **solar-powered lighting systems** to 225 earthquake-affected families.
- Enhance **safety and security**, especially during the night.
- Enable children to **study after dark** and families to resume basic home activities.
- Promote **environmentally sustainable energy** in disaster-affected rural areas.

3. Implementation Process

- **Assessment:** A rapid assessment of needs was conducted in collaboration with local leaders and volunteers in Myokying.
- **Procurement:** Reliable and durable solar lighting kits (including solar panels, LED lights, batteries) were purchased from a trusted supplier.
- **Distribution:** The lighting kits were distributed to 225 households by Sisters and community volunteers.
- **Training & Awareness:** Basic user training was provided to ensure proper installation and maintenance of the systems.

4. Beneficiaries

- Total Families Reached: **225**
- Estimated Individuals Benefited: **Approximately 1,200**
- Priority was given to **families with young children, elderly members, and persons with disabilities**.

5. Impact

- **Improved safety** and reduced the risk of accidents and crime in the dark.
- **Increased productivity** at home, especially in the evenings.
- **Children benefited** by having light to study at night.
- The project fostered **community resilience and environmental consciousness** through solar energy use.

6. Challenges

- Difficult terrain and poor road access slightly delayed the delivery process.
- Some families required follow-up support for proper installation.
